Reporting to the Biodiversity Management Branch, the successful incumbent will be required to manage the provision and maintenance of biodiversity and open space on a number of development sites with natural components.

- Managing the biodiversity at the Muizenberg East Biodiversity cluster according to biodiversity management plans, Operational Environmental Management plans, Annual Plans of Operation, providing information and guidance to developers on: site maintenance, landscaping, search and rescue procedures, etc.
- Interacting with community members, representatives and organisations to promote involvement in the Muizenberg East area, building capacity of local community champions in urban conservation through the development of friends groups and public participation.
- Providing input into the Biodiversity Management Branch through compiling reports for the Muizenberg East Conservation Cluster, working with various stakeholders and providing feedback for site meetings and reporting.
- Overseeing and mentoring students, interns, learnerships, volunteers and . temporary staff when required.
- Assist with conservation and operational activities for Zandvlei Estuary Nature Reserve when required
- Management of biodiversity of the Muizenberg East Cluster sites involves, . but is not limited to:
 - Invasive species management;
 - Heritage site management;
 - Biodiversity surveys;
 - Litter management; _
 - Camera trap management;
 - Human-wildlife conflict management (e.g. snake call outs and dealing with injured animals);
 - Fire management (ecological burns and wildfires, firebreaks)
 - Responding to ecological disasters (e.g. oil spills, pollution events and flooding)
 - Report and deal with illegal nature conservation activities under direction from the Reserve Supervisor
 - Carry out background research, coordinate and manage small conservation projects

- Compile monthly stats reports and comprehensive quarterly reports
- Attend/organise stakeholder and PAAC meetings
- Database management species lists etc.
- Oversee external contractors when required

- Strong nature conservation training and /or experience is essential
- Minimum two years of biodiversity management experience
- Additional courses and an understanding of City of Cape Town's procedures and by-laws, as well as NEMA are an added advantage.
- A strong understanding of urban conservation and the pressures that conservation satellite sites face
- An understanding of the City of Cape Town's conservation planning and of legislation and ROD's relating to the Department of Environmental Affairs and Development Planning.
- Experience in leading research projects and carrying out field work
- Valid Code 08 driver's license with minimum of 3 years driving experience (stipulate date of first license issued in your application)
- Will be required to work in all weather conditions
- Physically fit and able bodied.
- Prepared to work outside normal working hours, including evenings, public holidays and weekends at times
